LORD, HELP US SEE

In our very own city of Chicago, there was once a man, Dr. Jacob Bolotin, although his name that may not be known by the masses, he holds a very special place in medical history. He was born in 1888 and came from a Polish family who lived in poverty. Unfortunately, blindness was genetic in his family, and three out of the seven children in his family were born blind, including Jacob. Due to his disability, he quickly developed his other senses. After graduating from a school for the blind, Jacob worked as a salesman, selling brushes and typewriters on Chicago streetcars. His big dream was to become a doctor, but most colleges weren't willing to accept a blind student. After much persistence, he was finally accepted into the Chicago College of Medicine. When he graduated at the age of 24, he became the first blind person to become a licensed physician. Bolotin's specialty was studying diseases of the heart and lungs. Since he couldn't see his patients, he relied on his fingers and ears to diagnose a patient's ailments. One of many examples was his diagnosis of a young woman with an obstructed heart valve. He did it just by feeling her skin and listing to her heartbeat. In addition to his medical work, he traveled across the Midwest giving lectures on blindness and started the first all-blind Boy Scout troop. He passed away at a very young age of 36, but gave us an inspiration and an example for all of us to follow.

In today's Gospel of John, we read about the blindness of a man who was also blind from birth. Just like the Doctor, he had never been able to see anything. But on this day, he was to see, and his first image in life would be to meet the Lord. Jesus told to His disciples, "I am the light of the world." He would bring light to this blind man—because all he had seen his whole life was darkness. Jesus spit on the ground, made some mud and He put it on the man's eyes. The man could now see! This man who had never seen anything could now see it all. But what did he see? To this point, we only consider physical blindness not being able to see to see objects. The most important kind of blindness, is spiritual blindness — where we see with our eyes — but we can't see God, His love, His forgiveness, and His blessings. If a person has this kind of blindness, one may get lost and never find the way.

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In this passage, the Pharisees, the religious leaders of the day, were missing the bigger picture as many of us do. The Pharisees admit that the miracles were real. Something very fresh in our minds is the Resurrection. Then there were the disciples, who turned from uneducated workers into strong and inspired Apostles. They may have started with spiritual blindness, in time, they would be able to see very clearly. Christ came so that we can find and truly see the way to salvation.

ΚΥΡΙΑΚΗ ΤΟΥ ΤΥΦΛΟΥ

ΦΩΣ ΚΑΙ ΣΚΟΤΑΔΙ: ΔΥΟ ΠΡΑΓΜΑΤΙΚΟΤΗΤΕΣ «Φῶς εἰμι τοῦ χόσμου»

Προσίμιον: Φῶς καί σκοτάδι: δύο πραγματικότητες. 'Ο Χριστός, «τό φῶς τοῦ κόσμου» νίκησε τό σκοτάδι στό πρόσωπο τοῦ ἐκ γενετῆς τυφλοῦ, τόν ὁποῖο θεράπευσε με τή θαυματουργική του ἐνέργεια.

α. Ή πραγματικότητα τοῦ φωτός: Ὑπάρχει τό φῶς τοῦ ἤλιου, τό ἤλεκτρικό καὶ τεχνητό φῶς. Ὑπάρχει ὅμως καὶ τό ἀληθινό φῶς πού δὲν ἔχει καμιά σχέση μέ τά φυσικά ἤ τεχνητά φῶτα. Ἡ θεία ᾿Αποκάλυψη μᾶς πληροφορεῖ πώς τό φῶς αὐτό εἰναι ὁ Θεός! ᾿Αλλά καὶ ὅταν ὁ Υἰός τοῦ Θεοῦ ἔγινε ἄνθρωπος, διεκήρυξε καὶ εἰπε: «Φῶς εἰμι τοῦ κόσμου». Ὅταν γενννήθηκε, πραγματοποιήθηκε ἡ προφητεία τοῦ προφήτη Ἡσατα πού εἰχε διακηρύξει γι ᾿Αὐτόν: « Ὁ λαός ὁ καθήμενος ἐν σκότει εἰδε φῶς μέγα» (Ματθ. δ΄ 16). Καὶ πραγματικά, μέ τόν λόγο καὶ τό ἔργο του, ὅπως λ.χ. μέ τό θαῦμα τῆς θεραπείας τοῦ ἐκ γενετῆς τυφλοῦ, ὁ Χριστός ἀπέδειξε πώς ἡταν ὅντως «τό φῶς τοῦ κόσμου» (Ἰωάν. ἡ 12). Ὅσοι ἄνθρωποι δέχονται τόν λόγο τοῦ Χριστοῦ βρίσκουν τήν ἀλήθεια, τό «φῶς τό ἀληθινόν» (Ἰωάν. α΄ 9) καὶ γίνονται «υἰοί φωτός» (Ἰωάν. ιβ΄ 36).

β. Ή πραγματικότητα του σκότους: Υπάρχει όμως καί ή άλλη, ή αντίθετη πραγματικότητα: τό σκοτάδι. Όχι μόνο τό φυσικό, πού άλλωστε διακόπτεται από τό φως τῆς μέρας ἤ τό σκοτάδι τῆς τύφλωσης πού λίγο-πολύ ύπερνικαται από τίς άλλες αλσθήσεις. 'Αλλά τό μόνιμο και αδιάκοπο σκοτάδι. Πρόκειται γιά τό σκοτάδι τοῦ Κακοῦ, πηγή και άρχηγός τοῦ όποιου είναι ό διάβολος, «ό κοσμοκράτωρ τοῦ σκότους» ('Εφεσ. στ' 12). "Οπου χυριαρχεί τό κακό και ή άμαρτία έκεί άπλώνεται βαθύ τό σκοτάδι, ὁ θάνατος. "Οσοι ἄνθρωποι τελοῦν καί ύποστασιάζουν τό κακό, γίνονται ὄργανα τοῦ σκότους, τό σκοτάδι κυριαργεί στή ζωή και τά έργα τους, πού είναι «έργα του σκότους» (Ρωμ. ιγ 12). Καί ὄχι μόνο αὐτό. Τό σκοτάδι μάχεται κατά τοῦ φωτός. Μέ μανία, μέ μίσος, μέ σύστημα έξορμάει γιά νά σβήσει τό φως. "Αν γιά μιά ψυγή, όταν μπαίνει στό βασίλειο τοῦ φωτός «χαρά γίνεται εν οὐρανῷ» (Λουκ. ιε΄ 10), ἄλλη τόση χαρά, δαιμονική χαρά, γίνεται, ὅταν μιά ὕπαρξη κερδίζεται στό βασίλειο τοῦ σκότους... Αὐτή ἡ πάλη μεταξύ φωτός καί σκότους ἄρχισε μέσα στόν Παράδεισο καί θά τελειώσει στή Βασιλεία τοῦ Θεοῦ, μέ την όριστική γίκη τοῦ φωτός πάνω στό σκοτάδι.

Έπίλογος: Νά ζητᾶμε νά ἔλθει τό φῶς μέσα μας: « Ἑλθέτω ἡ βασιλεία σου» (Ματθ. στ΄ 10). Καί νά ἀγωνιζόμαστε νά ἀπλωθεῖ τό φῶς τοῦ Χριστοῦ γύρω μας. Νά χρατᾶμε ἀναμμένη τήν λαμπάδα τῆς πίστεως μέχρις ὅτου ἔλθει ὁ Νυμφίος, «ἐν τῷ μέσῳ τῆς νυχτός», νά μᾶς παραλάβει στό Βασίλειο τοῦ αἰωνίου φωτός.
